
Accomplishments

Here are some of the accomplishments that we made over the past year

- Substantially gained financial stability.
- Successfully launched two 20 week preapprenticeship training programs in Cape Breton in June 2013 and November 2013.
- Participated in the new TV commercial for the Mainland Building Trades. Check it out at www.buildrightns.ca.
- Worked with the Nova Scotia Construction Sector Council on a promotional campaign to attract high school students to register in the bricklaying and tile trade. We have our own booth in the workshop at their new building at 10 Ragged Lake Blvd. Unit 1, Halifax, NS.
- Working with Safety Check to set up a new scaffold course to the standard set out in the Nova Scotia's Occupational Safety Legislation CSASTD-B354.5 (8.4.5.2). The training program will be called occupant training, classes should be starting early March.
- Achieved new working relationship with the Department of Education on compulsorily certification in the Bricklaying trade. New regulations have been completed which gives us a better understanding of the bricklayers' scope of work.
- We have become members of the Nova Scotia Construction Sector Council which will open the door for various grants in safety training programs, opportunities for new apprentices to have funding made available for 20 week preapprenticeship programs and completing their block apprenticeship training.

These are just some of the advancements we have made. We continue to make progress every day.
